As the Christmas story goes, "T'was the night before Christmas when all through the house, not a creature was stirring, not even a mouse."

Regardless of what winter holiday you celebrate, it is not so quiet in the City's house. During the holiday breaks you may hear the following noises: a keyboard clicking as the City Office breaks down its 1,100-line item budget to Council. The sound of metal scraping along the streets as Public Works plows our streets. Tires crunching through snow as our Police Officers patrol the town. And the voices of department supervisors and Council as they debate the final budget.

To make our jobs easier this winter, please remember the following:

- 1. During a designated snow event, no vehicle shall be parked in or on any part of the public street or public right of way.
- 2. Property owners shall remove snow, ice, and accumulations from sidewalks within 24 hours.
- 3. It's physics- the heavier the snow, the faster our plows need to drive to push it. Faster driving means snow gets pushed further onto your property. We wish we could drive slower when plowing, but it's not always possible.
- 4. Water and sewer main breaks generally take place in freezing temperatures. Please follow our Facebook page for the quickest information. If you have no running water during non-office hours, please call Cedar County Dispatch at (563) 886-2121.

LOST Referendum: Vote No and Your Property Taxes Increase

November 4, 2014 voters approved a local option sales tax. The vote barely surpassed the 60% threshold. By state law, a LOST or local option sales tax referendum may only last up to ten years. The City will be working to place a referendum on the November 2023 ballot.

Where did this money go? It went to establishing two new parks; Cubby and Wapsi Park. In addition, it brought sheltered bathrooms to Lions Park and other upgrades to Beranek Park.

Simply put, if voters don't agree to tax everyone who spends money in town, the City will have to raise taxes on property owners by default. Until the Cubby Park bond is paid off, taxes have to come from somewhere.

The sales tax graph above illustrates what your tax rate will be if the next LOST referendum isn't passed. A \$2.00 increase is roughly \$225 a year for a home valued at \$200,000. In terms of the last 10 years it has saved a property owner roughly \$2,250.

We hope you continue to follow the LOST referendum and vote yes in support of future projects at a lower property tax rate.

NEW PROGRAM!


1000 Hours Outside Challenge


