Spring

Nuisance abatements are our least favorite part of the job, but a necessary one. The City actively enforces nuisances for a number of reasons:

- · Protecting the health, safety, and general welfare of your neighborhood
- Properties in disrepair discourage investments and can create a habitat for unwanted animals
- We want to protect our historic small-town atmosphere

Last year we focused on junk vehicles and mowing. This year we will be focusing on uncontrolled vegetation and property maintenance such as broken or missing windows, failing foundations, and roofs or siding in disrepair. Generally, we start proactively enforcing nuisances on April 1st.

Please remember we do not enjoy this work. And as long as you work with us and have a plan, we are willing to accommodate to your circumstances.

About the Speaker: Dr. Calder has been a faculty member at UTSA since 1979, teaching and publishing first as a member of the Department of Criminal Justice until 2006, then to present in the Department of Political Science and Geography. In recent years, his teaching in Political Science has included topics in global affairs, homeland security, the intelligence community and world affairs, federal justice policymaking, and politics in film. His articles and books have focused mainly on security matters, political leaders, and crime control policies, including studies of American presidents and their roles in directing federal actions against organized crime.



Storytimes


Join Ms. Becky for books and fun at the library!



In 2022 West Branch Community Development Group secured a technical service grant to assist with a complete rebranding project. The 6 months the process included a site visit from a national branding expert, a task force of local leaders, 4 focus groups and work with a graphic designer to ultimately establish a toolkit of logos, designs and themes that create a clear, strong and positive perception of the organization and our community as a destination.



When West Branch first earned accreditation from the Main Street Iowa and Main Street America in 2006 the organization adopted the name of "Main Street West Branch" and even during our 7 years doing business as WBCDG our mission, vision and daily work have focused on supporting West Branch as a whole by strengthening our downtown through economic vitality work, promotion, special events and historic preservation efforts. Focus groups confirmed that our organization's previous name, West Branch Community Development Group, was confusing, ambiguous and just plain too long. We listened!

It's time to keep it simple. Embrace change. Celebrate our roots. The organization will officially be called **Main Street West Branch** moving forward, and our logo has been updated to reflect this and to leverage a new tool in our belt.


Sweets for Success Friday, April 14 - 6pm - 10pm Little Lights on the Lane
