FROM THE DESK OF THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

Summer is just around the corner and there is so much happening in this vibrant historic town. Council's 2023-2028 capital improvement plan is underway. You will see a lot of construction south of town, on north 6th Street, and west of town.

Planning and Zoning Commission has been engaged in several discussions on what the future of West Branch should look like. In the near future, there will likely be design standards to maintain our small-town feel. We won't always be a small town, but we can preserve that small town feel with proper zoning and design techniques which also minimize the increased cost of housing.

Historic Preservation Commission led an effort to preserve James Townsend's Traveler's Rest. The home sits on East Main St. and was once home to escaped slaves traveling on the Underground Railroad. The Commission seeking to become a Certified Local Government (CLG) in which the city get access to exclusive grants to promote awareness or improve historic sites.

Property tax assessment and property tax reform have been recent discussions lately. Staff are still researching the effect of the property reform legislation. But state legislative mandated tax cuts will likely lead to a cut in service we can offer. Please be patient with your locally elected officials and staff. We understand your desire to preserve the many services we offer, such as a topnotch library, robust parks and recreation opportunities, leaf pickup, brush pickup, strong community policing, a responsive volunteer first responder group, and many others. We will do everything we can to listen to you, but staff projects state legislative mandated property tax reforms will equal a cut in local services.

Last day: Thursday, September 21, 2023 – 5:00 p.m.

- July 1 Water rate increases from \$7.75 to \$9.74 per 1,000 gallons to pay for east side water main project.
- July 15 Projected end of roundabout construction. (Subject to weather.)
- August 4-5 Hoover's Hometown Days
- November 15 Projected deadline for east side water main phase I project.

SUMMERTIME 'BEST OF' 3-PART SERIES:

Lou Henry Hoover's White House Years

June 15, 2023 6pm

When Lou Henry Hoover moved into the White House on March 4, 1929, she looked forward to using her influence to strengthen the areas that were near and dear to her heart: women's opportunities, the arts, and private philanthropy. The onset of what we now call the Great Depression challenged Lou's plans, but she saw new opportunities for serving the nation and remained undaunted. Lou continued to blaze a trail of achievements that have often been forgotten.

The Lafayette Escadrille

July 20, 2023 6pm

A century ago 38 Americans from every walk of life volunteered to fly in the First World War. It was their own idea—to fight in the skies to aid our oldest ally, France, long before the United States entered the war, and helped move their reluctant nation to join the Allies and enter the fight. And they were willing to pay the ultimate price. They were the Lafayette Escadrille. We'll hear from the film's director, Darroch Greer along with Paul Glenshaw.

The Herbert Hoover Presidential Library and Museum's entire collection of decorated World War I Belgian Relief flour sacks, decorated by Belgian schoolgirls, women and artists, was subjected to a close examination in June 2022. Annelien van Kempen, visiting researcher from The Netherlands, and Marcus Eckhardt, Hoover Presidential Museum curator, studied every detail. They will present what they discovered in their fascinating two-week search in this episode.
